VICTORIA, BC – The Royal BC Museum has gratefully accepted a significant collection of Eocene Epoch fossils from the McAbee Fossil Beds Heritage Site in BC, near Cache Creek.

The collection, of an estimated 18,000 specimens, was made by the late John Leahy, who co-managed the site while it was under mineral tenure.

Select fossils from this remarkable trove will be on display, and Royal BC Museum experts will be on hand to explain their significance to media.
