Visitors to *Orcas:* Our Shared Future can take a deep dive into the lives of whales through dramatic displays (including three life-size orca replicas), immersive games and provocative videos. Guests of all ages will explore currents of ecological activism, popular culture and Indigenous beliefs to gain a deeper understanding of how orcas and humans are inextricably connected.

And of course, a movie at the IMAX® Victoria is always popular with the whole family. Why not check out the awe-inspiring Antarctica, catch a last look at Humpback Whales, or buckle your seatbelt for a trip Into America's Wild.
